

Summary of current situation

What was achieved this week:

- A total of 2,199 fuel station inspections have been undertaken since the start of our inspection blitz in early March, resulting in 111 infringements issued.
- Fuel supplies are stable for July and August and fuel station stockouts remain low across the State.
- Despite the recent escalation in hostilities in the Middle East, fuel cargoes continue to arrive as planned.
- There is more fuel in WA now than at the same time last year.
- The State Fuel Controller is working closely with fuel companies and distributors to address any supply chain constraints.
- 20 million litres of diesel, as part of our nation-leading strategic stockpile, are in place and accessible in Wyndham, Esperance, Geraldton, Kalgoorlie, and Kwinana.
- This 100% WA-owned stockpile will allow us to respond quickly to any potential acute shortages and shore up fuel security in regional areas.
- Holders of a valid WA driver's licence can claim the \$100 Fuel Support Payment. To date, over 750,000 Western Australians have successfully claimed the payment. More information at wa.gov.au/FuelPayment
