

Summary of current situation

What was achieved this week:

- A total of 2,329 fuel station inspections have been undertaken since the start of our inspection blitz in early March, resulting in 111 infringements issued.
- Earlier this week the WA Government announced, together with the Federal Government, we're taking the first steps towards building a fuel refinery right here in WA.
- A local refinery would help strengthen our fuel security and ensure WA has a more reliable supply into the future.
- Fuel supplies are stable for July and August and fuel station stockouts remain low across the State.
- There is more fuel in WA now than at the same time last year.
- As part of our nation leading response to the global fuel shock, we're continuing to work actively with industry to ensure WA has access to the most detailed supply chain information in the country.
- We have also expanded FuelWatch to include every retailer in the State to help identify pressure points and required fuel stations to report stockouts.
- Over 900,000 Western Australians have claimed the \$100 Fuel Support Payment. More information at wa.gov.au/FuelPayment
