

Summary of current situation

What was achieved this week:

- A total of 2,522 fuel station inspections have been undertaken since the start of our inspection blitz in early March, resulting in 117 infringements issued.
- A Bill was introduced into Parliament this week to further strengthen FuelWatch. We will make permanent the requirement for fuel retailers to provide accurate information about motor fuel availability, supply and stock levels, including when fuel is temporarily unavailable.
- This week, the Federal Government released its fuel security and resilience package [Australia's Fuel Security and Resilience Package - Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water](#)
- The WA Government will seek to have its fair share of the 1 billion litre Australian strategic fuel reserve based here; this will be in addition to the existing WA Strategic Diesel Stockpile.
- Fuel supplies are stable for August and September and fuel station stockouts remain low across the State.
- There is more fuel in WA now than at the same time last year.
- We're continuing to work actively with industry to ensure WA has access to the most detailed supply chain information in the country.
- Over 1,038,000 Western Australians have claimed the \$100 Fuel Support Payment. More information at wa.gov.au/FuelPayment
